Clear out the clutter

In the New Testament the Greek word for prune also means cleanse. Pruning does not harm the plant but removes dead wood so it can grow stronger and bear more fruit. My father used to say, "Let your worst enemy prune your roses", they must be cut back hard to flourish.

When Jesus spoke of the vine, his hearers knew the image well. Vines were common in Palestine, but they needed constant care. For the first three years a vine was cut back drastically to conserve life and strength. Fruit-bearing branches were nurtured, but unfruitful ones were removed so the plant's energy was not wasted. The wood itself was useless, fit only for burning. Jesus applied this image to his followers: either fruitful or barren.

First, he was thinking of the people of Israel. They had been God's vine, yet repeatedly ignored judges, prophets, and kings. Though warned, they fell back into disobedience and were cut off, even exiled. In Jesus' day many rejected him, leading to the final scattering in AD 70.

Second, he was thinking of us. As branches, we too must be "pruned", removing what hinders our faith. We glorify God in our words and actions, letting our light shine. We must remain in Christ; as coals keep burning only when together, so without prayer, fellowship, and Scripture, our life quickly fades. And as branches we should live in God's joy, not dependent on circumstances but rooted in Christ. Jesus chose us (John 15:16). That privilege brings


responsibility: to clear out the clutter and let him shape our lives for his glory.
