What not to say to someone with dementia

DO: LET'S HAVE A CUP OF TEA NOW

Long complex sentences can be difficult to grasp for those with dementia. It's difficult to process several ideas at once as cognitive abilities slow down, so it's better to give directions or instructions one step at a time.

Instead try this: Use short simple sentences as much as possible. Avoid speaking in loud or busy environments and wait until you have the person's full attention before you start. During the conversation give the person time to process what you are saying. For those interested, a copy of 'Contented Dementia' by Oliver James is available to borrow at the back of church.
