Trinity Sunday

Having taught Religious Education for more years than I care to remember, it's always fascinating to see what really gets students thinking. An increased emphasis on ethical issues and philosophical questions guarantees interest but there is also a theological question that regularly causes curiosity: How can Christians believe in one God, but also say that God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit? To many, it sounds like three gods—or just plain confusing!

To help make sense of it, I (as we all probably do!) have often turned to the image of water. H₂O can be ice, liquid, or steam—three forms, but still one substance. It's not a perfect analogy (no analogy for God ever is), but it gives us a starting point. God is one, yet exists in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit each with different roles. In John 16:12–15 we find Jesus preparing His disciples for the time when he will no longer be with them physically. He promises the Spirit, who will guide them into truth, speak to the believer what He hears and glorify Jesus. In these verses, we catch a glimpse of the deep connection within the Trinity: The Father sends the Son, the Son glorifies the Father, the Spirit reveals the Son—it feels rather like a divine dance of giving, receiving, and honouring...

At the heart of the Trinity is **relationship**. God is not a solitary being on a throne, but a living community of love. That's more than theology—it's profoundly practical. We are made in the image of this relational God. Therefore we too are made for community, for interdependence, for love that gives and receives.

We live in a world that appears to prize independence and self-sufficiency, encouraging people to stand on their own two feet. Yet so many people crave (and lack) connection. The Holy Trinity reminds us that this is where true strength lies. Just as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are different but always together, we are made to be ourselves—but not by ourselves. We are meant to live in relationship: with God, and with one another.

The Trinity isn't just a mystery to understand; it's a relationship to enter, and a pattern to live by. I wonder how our world would be if we all truly lived this way....

Pioneering Parishes

Maybe you've heard the term 'pioneering' used of certain church activities, or heard people referred to as 'Pioneer Ministers' ...and maybe you've wondered 'what's that all about?'

As the name suggests, pioneer ministry is predominantly outward focussed, directed towards those not already part of the worshipping community — and one of its key features is that it tends to emerge from something else that is already happening, which God seems to be really using to draw people together.

Lichfield Diocese have enlisted the services of an organisation called Pioneering Parishes, who enable churches to become more outward-looking and recognise what God is already doing in their midst and in their communities - things which can become opportunities for engaging people with the Christian faith. They have already begun working with Rugeley Deanery and now Wem & Whitchurch Deanery have asked if Hodnet Deanery would like to join with them to explore how they might help our churches too.
