

## 17th August 2025



Berlin, in the middle of the night on the 13<sup>th</sup> August 1961, while most slept, others were hard at work. Come the morning the city was divided. Barbed wire separated East from West, families and loved ones. Hopes and dreams of freedom were shattered. The scale and scope of the wall created a great scar through the heart of the city. Yet, for some in the West it would become a tourist attraction. I remember looking out across the void between East and West at Checkpoint Charlie in the 1970s.

Today, around the world, new walls and barriers are being erected. But I'm always reminded by the Berlin Wall, that a wall that can keep people out can also keep people in.

This all leads me to reflect, not just on physical barriers, but also spiritual, especially that barrier between us and God – sin. It can hold us prisoner. Cut off from the freedom to be fully the people God created us to be. Isolated from the love and peace that a relationship with God can bring us. Rather like the Berlin Wall, we will find no way across by ourselves.

Today is a sad anniversary, for on this day in 1962, the terrible consequences of the Berlin Wall were revealed in the tragic death of a teenager, Peter Fechter. His attempt to cross over failed when border guards shot him. For about an hour he lay bleeding to death, no one would or could come to his aid. Onlookers could only watch. A stark warning that freedom can come at a terrible price. All attempts to find our own way back to God will not succeed.

The good news is that when we cry out for help, or if we feel spiritually separated, wounded even, our cries are not met with silence, we are not abandoned. For through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ the barrier of sin is broken: the wall has been torn down by grace and mercy. And as we are reminded in our services today, as we focus on the cross of Jesus, our freedom has been won at a terrible cost. His death, though tragic, was not a failure. For he won for us reconciliation with God, and we can have a new relationship with him as a loving Father.

Reconciliation lies at the heart of the Church's purpose.

It is our mission, our work, and our joy!
