The passage for today from Acts follows on from the account in the previous chapter which tells us of Peter's visit to the house of Cornelius, a Roman centurion and a Gentile. This was a momentous occasion for Peter, since at that time it was against the Jewish law for a Jew to associate with or visit a Gentile. While there, in the house of Cornelius, which was filled with Gentiles, you can imagine the astonishment of Peter and the circumcised believers who were with him, when they witnessed the gift of the Holy Spirit being poured out on the Gentiles present. Today's passage tells us that when news of this reached the circumcised believers they were critical of Peter's actions and he had to go to Jerusalem to defend himself. You can see that at that time, racism was deeply imbedded in that early Christian Church and it was a very difficult thing for them to deal with. We even read in Galatians that, much later on, Paul had to rebuke Peter because Peter had drawn back and separated himself from the Gentiles because he was afraid of the criticism from some of the circumcised Christians.

I guess this is a reminder to all of us of two things. Firstly, that we do not consider anybody of less value than ourselves, particularly in God's sight. Constantly we need to remind ourselves that we are what we are, not because of anything we have done but solely because of what Christ has done for us. No matter how good we think we are, let us remember that along with everybody else in the world, we are "all sinners and have fallen short of God's glory". Secondly, the wonderful truth that "God so loved the world, that he gave his one and only Son, that WHOEVER believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life"; and what Peter himself said to the crowd of mixed race on the day of Pentecost: "EVERYONE who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved" - that includes you and me. Hallelujah!
