The Persistent Widow

Jesus' prayer life was second to none. So who better to tell his disciples "They should always pray and not give up." The story in Luke 18 is simple yet profound: a widow, one of the most vulnerable in society, keeps coming to an unjust judge, pleading for justice. Though he neither fears God nor cares about people, her persistence wears him down until he grants her request, not because he is righteous, but because she refuses to be silenced.

This is not a story about manipulating God, but about the nature of faith. The widow's persistence is not nagging, it's courage. She stands for all who refuse to give up hope in the face of delay or apparent silence. Her insistence springs from trust that justice **should** come, and that it **will** come.

If even an unjust judge can be moved by persistence, how much more will God, who is just and loving, respond to his people's cries? Jesus reminds us that prayer is not only about asking; it's about relationship, about holding on to God even when the night is long and the answer is slow.

The question Jesus ends with is searching: "When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" It's not simply about belief, but endurance, the faith that keeps praying, keeps hoping, keeps standing before God in confidence and trust.

Like the widow, may we never lose heart, but keep faith alive through persistent prayer and the sure hope that God's justice will come.
