Easter Day

He is Risen. Hallelujah

Women played an important role as followers of Jesus. So, it was very logical that several women, including Mary Magdalene, went to the tomb of Jesus early on the first day of the week, bringing spices they had prepared to anoint His body. They found the stone rolled away and the tomb empty, with two angels inside who told them that Jesus had risen. The women were initially terrified and confused, but the angels reminded them of Jesus' prophecy that He would rise on the third day. The women then went to tell the disciples, but their words were met with scepticism, (typical men!) and Peter, being Peter, ran to the tomb to verify what they had said.

The resurrection of Jesus marks the dramatic turning point in the Christian faith. It emphasizes the fulfilment of Jesus' promise to rise again, offering hope and the assurance of God's power over death. The women's role is pivotal in this narrative as they are the first witnesses of the resurrection, showing that God's grace extends to those society might overlook, and it would extend to everyone later on. The initial disbelief of the disciples mirrors human doubt and the difficulty in accepting miraculous events, but it highlights the importance of faith in the unseen.

The resurrection is not just an event in history but an ongoing reality that invites all believers to live in hope, knowing that, as Christ was raised, so too can we rise with Him in new life.



What not to say to someone with dementia



This is the second in the series of articles where we are sharing some words and questions to try and avoid using when talking with a person with Dementia.



Why? Asking questions about the past can be stressful for someone with dementia if they can't remember the answer. It's better to focus on what's happening in the present. Instead of asking them about their day, speak briefly about your day and give them time to ask questions. Talk to them about the present and use items in the environment, such as photos to stimulate conversation. Open questions can be difficult for people with dementia if they can't remember the answer.
