Fully Human, Completely Divine

Do you remember how and why you came to faith? For some, like Paul, it was a single transformative moment; for many others, including me, it was the gradual realisation that life and living only makes sense when Jesus is at the centre of all that we think and do. There are many ways to identify with and follow Jesus. Most of us will remember particular moments of recognition, inspiration and transformation which put us on a path of reconciliation with God, through discipleship and growth to become more like Jesus.

In Paul's letter to the Colossians a key theme is that Jesus is, all the time, both God and human. Here he affirms Christ's presence and active engagement in creation - there is nothing that He has not touched. This is Christ as God, awesome, unfathomable and all powerful. And yet, despite all this, He came to us, a baby born in the usual way who grew up, just as we do, to be an adult in a complex bewildering world. We can respond to Jesus through our common humanity and this connects us directly to a God who yearns for us to love him just as he loves us. Notice how Paul identifies himself as a servant of the gospel. He reminds us and encourages us that, like him, our role is to serve the gospel, to follow God's working through it and to listen to where it leads.

In Luke's gospel Jesus teaches us through word and example, through story and memorable sayings, through healing and deliverance. He is building a community shaped by the values of God's Kingdom radical ways of thinking, behaving and relating that nurture the well-being of all at the expense of none. At Martha and Mary's house we find the King of Kings and Lord of Lords taking the time, as a human, to rest and recover from His work. Above all, He gently listens to the tribulations of Martha and lovingly points her to the best way forward, reconciliation with Him and with Mary. Now that's an example we are all able to follow.
