## Desperate measures

Most of us will have experienced that awful feeling that we are never, ever going to achieve something for which we have longed. Circumstances always turned against us, often at the last moment, and nothing good seemed to emerge from the events that surrounded us. Our circumstances were driving us to despair, and we were giving up any hope we had for a positive outcome. This is the starting point for both of our readings this week. We are treated to two beautifully constructed stories which are rich in detail, dramatic, exciting and easy to digest and remember. In our Old Testament reading Elijah is at his wits end as he faces the prospect that the nation he loved and served had turned completely away from God. In the land of the Gerasenes, Jesus encounters a demon-possessed man at the end of his tether - his illness and behaviour were so extreme that he had been cast out of his town, thrown into chains (which could not restrain him) and left to live in the cemetery.

What links these stories together is the way that the sufferers find healing and purpose through an encounter with God. Elijah, severely depressed, seeks God at Mount Sinai and, like Moses before him, is not disappointed. God's earthquake, wind and fire pass in front of Elijah and in the following silence he meets face to face with God, who restores him to health and gives him new purpose. God sends Elijah back home to Israel to fulfil his prophetic mission there. The demonpossessed man may not have been looking for God but he recognised him in Jesus as soon as he saw him. He took his chance completely to be healed but at great cost to the herd of pigs. Jesus commanded him to go home and tell the wonderful story of how Jesus had made him whole once more.

However badly life seems to treat us, however desperate we feel, these stories, and many others, remind us that wherever we are, God has got their first and is waiting to ameliorate our wounds and transform our lives. He will also send us out with new and enriched purpose.

## **Pioneering Parishes**

Maybe you've heard the term 'pioneering' used of certain church activities, or heard people referred to as 'Pioneer Ministers' ...and maybe you've wondered 'what's that all about?'

As the name suggests, pioneer ministry is predominantly outward focussed, directed towards those not already part of the worshipping community and one of its key features is that it tends to emerge from something else that is already happening, which God seems to be really using to draw people together. Lichfield Diocese have enlisted the services of an organisation called Pioneering Parishes, who enable churches to become more outward-looking and recognise what God is already doing in their midst and in their communities - things which can become opportunities for engaging people with the Christian faith. They have already begun working with Rugeley Deanery and now Wem & Whitchurch Deanery have asked if Hodnet Deanery would like to join with them to explore how they might help our churches too. A taster session will be held on Saturday 28th June,

9.30am-3.30pm at St Mary's Parish Rooms. Anybody who is interested is welcome.
