A warm welcome to Finlay Platts and his family and friends as he is baptised today.

Called, Changed, and Drawn Together in Christ

Both readings today invite us to reflect on call, conversion and the grace that reshapes both individuals and the whole Church.

Peter asks Jesus a very human question: "We have left everything to follow you, what then will there be for us?" Jesus does not dismiss the sacrifice but gently reframes it. God's kingdom is not built on comparison or entitlement. Instead, it overturns our assumptions: "Many who are first will be last, and many who are last will be first." Discipleship is not about status, but about trust in God's generous grace. Saul is convinced he is right, convinced he is serving God, yet he is blind to the truth. On the road to Damascus, Christ does not destroy him but transforms him. Saul is humbled, blinded, and then healed. He must receive the gospel through the hands of Ananias, a member of the very community he once persecuted. Conversion leads not only to faith in Christ, but to belonging within the Body.

As we come to the end of the Week for Christian Unity, these readings challenge us to humility. Like Peter, we can be tempted to measure faithfulness by what we have given up. Like Saul, we can be certain our tradition or viewpoint is the right one. Yet Christ meets us all on the road calling us to repentance, deeper faith, and renewed fellowship.

Unity is not uniformity, but shared submission to Christ. Arising from this week, may we be willing to be changed, to listen, and to recognise Christ can work beyond our own assumptions so that, together, we may bear witness to the reconciling love of God.
