Raised to New Life

When I meet with parents to prepare for the baptism of their children, we think about the symbols used in the baptism service: we sign each child with the sign of the **cross;** we baptize them in **water** and we give them the gift of a **candle**.

The cross is such a powerful symbol, encapsulating the very core of our faith: that humankind was helpless to deal with all our sin, but that God made us a way to forgiveness and that way was the cross. We're all guilty of thinking we know how best to run our lives, usually with very little thought to how God wants us to live. And we see the consequences of that every day in the news. It's easy to think that it's all that big stuff that is the problem, but every selfish act, unkind thought, unloving word, however inconsequential they seem to us, all of it adds to the mountain of things that separate us from God. BUT THROUGH JESUS GOD BRINGS US FORGIVENESS and everything that causes us guilt, shame, regret, remorse is nailed to the cross - all of it...dealt with, removed, disarmed (Colossians 2.15). The cross might seem like a symbol of death and defeat, but to the Christian it is a symbol of triumph.

The water we use in a baptism also symbolises that forgiveness and fresh start, free from sin, that Jesus brings us. But, if you've ever seen a full immersion baptism, you'll also have seen that powerful and vivid enactment of the 'old life' going down and the 'new life' being raised up. As St Paul says, we are buried with Jesus in baptism and also raised with him, through our faith in the God who raised Jesus from the dead (Colossians 2.1).

Baptism is just the beginning though. As forgiven people, full of the new life that God gives us, we have a purpose – to continue on and live our lives for Christ, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith and overflowing with thankfulness (Colossians 2. 6-7). The candle is the symbol of that new life that we take forward with us and out into the world, so that it (we) can be a sign to others that forgiveness and hope and new life is available for them too.
