It was J. S. Fry & Sons Ltd who produced in the UK the first chocolate egg in 1873. The Bristol based chocolate business was founded by Joseph Fry, a Quaker. There are many traditions surrounding the Easter egg and the egg has been a symbol of new birth for many years.

The death of Jesus came as a great shock to those who knew him, but I wonder why? Jesus had told them many times what would happen but the "penny had not dropped". I sometimes wonder how the disciples spent the rest of Friday through to very early Sunday morning - the 3rd day. I guess they were bewildered, distraught and very afraid. Would the Romans get them next? I suspect they were desperate to visit the tomb!

It is interesting that the two Mary's were at the tomb first and found that Jesus was not there. And even when presented with the evidence of the folded grave clothes at the tomb they were still mystified. Grave robbers do not leave grave clothes behind.

The angels' words "why do you seek the living among the dead, he us not here he is risen" made them remember Jesus words but they were still perplexed.

Jesus' death and resurrection heralded in new life for all, to say that Jesus' death accomplished redemption for us means that it accomplished deliverance from our captivity through the payment of a price. There are three things we had to be released from: the curse of the law, the guilt of sin, and the power of sin. Jesus' death did just that!


The women, Peter and John saw and believed but understanding would come later.
