Worry or Hope

It is perfectly natural to have fears and concerns – life throws us plenty of challenges and uncertainties. But there are two contrasting ways we can approach those situations: worry or hope. Jesus names worry as a way of living and thinking that's rooted in fear about material needs: food, drink, clothing, and tomorrow itself (Matthew 6:25-32). He doesn't deny that these things matter; rather, he shifts our perspective on them. By pointing to the birds of the air and the lilies of the field, Jesus invites us to see a world that is sustained by God's attentive care. Worry, in this light, is not simply anxiety but a failure of trust, leading us to a kind of tunnel vision that forgets who holds our futures. Hope, as Paul describes it, is different from optimism or wishful thinking (Romans 8:24-25). "Hope that is seen is not hope," he writes, because true hope is exercised precisely when the outcome is unclear. This kind of hope requires patience and endurance, qualities that worry erodes. Worry demands immediate resolution; hope accepts delay whilst holding firm to trust: trust in what has been promised, even if it hasn't yet been revealed.

It's hard for worry and hope to fully co-exist. Worry fixes our attention on what could go wrong or what we stand to lose; while hope anchors our hearts to the one who knows our needs and loves us beyond measure. Seeking his kingdom directs our attention away from anxious self-preservation and towards trustful dependence on God.

To live in hope, then, is not to ignore uncertainty but to inhabit it differently, releasing the illusion of control and instead waiting attentively, believing that God is at work beyond what we can see. In a world full of reasons to worry, we are called to a quieter, braver response: trusting for today, waiting with patience, and letting hope shape how we face tomorrow.
